2.1 Classification of mixture or substance:

Not classified as dangerous.

2.3 Other hazards: This material is not considered to be persistent, bioaccumulating nor toxic (PBT),

very persistent nor very bioaccumulating (vPvB). Contains silica sand. The grain size distribution means that it is not hazardous. However, any respirable crystalline silica dust generated by processing and handling of silica sand may cause health effects. Prolonged and/or massive inhalation of respirable crystalline silica dust may cause lung fibrosis, commonly referred to as silicosis. Principal symptoms of silicosis are cough and breathlessness. Occupational exposure to respirable crystalline silica

should be monitored and controlled.
